

Stanford-SFUSD Partnership 2024 Year-in-Review

The Stanford-SFUSD Partnership is where research, practice, and policy works together to help each and every child in San Francisco thrive.

Stanford and SFUSD work collaboratively on research with the community to advance equity and learning for all students in San Francisco.

The partnership values collaboration, actionable, real-time, deep research, and disruption of traditional power differences between researchers and practitioners.

Our Objectives and Work



Research advances SFUSD leaders' work to reach its goals.

The partnership had 15 active projects in 2024 between Stanford and SFUSD ranging from topics such as designing and testing an inclusive ethnic studies course and evaluating the Shoestrings program aimed at interrupting the disproportionality of Black / African American students placed in Special Education.



Ensure "research engaged decision-making" by increasing use of past, present, and future research.

This year the partnership transitioned a long running survey of teachers, leaders, and other staff conducted by Stanford / Brown University to an internal survey administered by SFUSD's research department to create more opportunities for the survey data to inform decision-making as an internal tool.



Strengthen the impact of our partnership by learning from and sharing with other effective partnerships.

SFUSD leaders and Stanford researchers present their work at national research conferences (e.g., American Education Research Association) and practice conferences (e.g. Council of Great City Schools). As a member of the National Network of Education Research-Practice Partnerships (NNERPP), the Stanford-SFUSD Partnership joined NNERPP's new California RPP network, where the members of NNERPP in California support collective works among the 13 RPPs.



Improving principal feedback to teachers about instruction

One project focused on measuring teacher's implementation of high-quality instruction via an observational rubric called the CORE Rubric. The Stanford and SFUSD teams surveyed principals and teachers about the implementation of the CORE rubric and whether conditions were in place to meet this guardrail. The SFUSD team used the findings to prepare their principals to improve their efforts at providing high quality feedback to teachers about their classroom instruction.



Reducing overrepresentation of Black students in Special Education

Another project focused on reducing the disproportionality of Black / African American students referred to Special Education and worked to evaluate the implementation and impact of SFUSD's Shoestrings program. Research suggests students and schools engaged in the Shoestrings program had a reduced number of students placed in certain Special Education programs.
